

Checklist for Flammable and Combustible Liquid Storage

Regulatory Compliance: Verify adherence to OSHA and NFPA standards.
Approved Containers: Use containers and tanks designed for flammable and combustible liquids.
Labeling: Ensure all containers are clearly labeled.
Ventilation: Store liquids in well-ventilated areas.
Fire Suppression: Equip storage areas with fire suppression systems.
Emergency Exits: Ensure emergency exits are accessible.
Segregation: Separate incompatible materials.
Spill Control: Implement spill control measures.
Inspections: Conduct regular inspections of storage areas and containers.
Employee Training: Train employees on handling and storage procedures.
Maintenance: Address any issues promptly.
